Stewardship 2021 - "We Are an Offering" Commitment Sunday - Nov. 14

The first known Christian fund drive was conducted by the Apostle Paul in the New Testament. He went to the relatively affluent churches of Greece and Asia Minor to ask an offering for the desperately poor church of Jerusalem. The Jerusalem church was poor because it was the church of Jesus, who loved and welcomed the poor.

The Christians of Macedonia (Greece) gave generously, and Paul commended them: "They gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own free will." And the source of their generosity was this: "They gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us" (2 Corinthians 8:3-5).

The first step of Christian giving has nothing to do with a check book or debit card. It is a matter of the heart. The Christians of Macedonia *gave themselves first to the Lord*. Their first commitment was to Jesus, everything else followed. Jesus said, *Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also* (Matthew 6:21).

As you consider your giving for 2022, I pray that you will give yourself *first to the Lord*. When we consider what God has done for us in the gift of his Son, our first response must be to give our whole selves. This puts our financial giving in a whole new light. We are an offering.
