"Boldness and Confidence"

... Christ Jesus our Lord, in whom we have boldness and access with confidence through our faith in him. – Ephesians 3:11-12

This is a statement of complete assurance and confidence, written by a man whose pride had been smashed. Saul of Tarsus was educated, powerful, and arrogant. He hated the followers of Jesus. The Book of Acts says, Saul was ravaging the church, and entering house after house, he dragged off men and women and committed them to prison (Acts 8:3). The extent of Saul's pride is captured in his own words: If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more . . . a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless (Philippians 3:4-6).

But as Saul was on the way to Damascus, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord (Acts 9:1), he was dramatically humiliated by the One who alone has true glory and majesty. Jesus Christ appeared to him – literally – as a blinding light. He fell to the ground and Jesus spoke to him: Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me? (Acts 9:4) Saul was blinded, and so devastated that he could not eat or drink for three days. The pride of Saul was destroyed by the hand of Jesus Christ. But surprisingly, when his sight was restored and he was baptized as a Christian, his massive arrogance had been replaced with confidence. He stood in the synagogue of Damascus and said of Jesus, He is the Son of God (Acts 9:20).

Are you confused by the distinction between arrogance and confidence? Don't be. Paul (new name!) was now confident in the grace that God gave him, but the old pride had been broken. God redirected Paul's zeal away from himself and toward the gospel of Jesus Christ. Pride takes credit for what it achieves on its own, while *boldness* and *confidence* stand strong because they recognize the power and presence of One greater. Only the grace of God can lead you from one to the other.
